Solitary thyroid nodule

41 years old woman presents with a painless central neck mass. Otherwise well. On examination there is a 2 cm mass in the thyroid with no associated lymphadenopathy

- 1. What is the most likely diagnosis?
- 2. What is the chance that this is malignant?
- 3. What investigations should be performed

Case 2

Follicular carcinoma of thyroid

50-year-old man presents following imaging for backpain. A lesion in the thoracic spine is identified, which is suspicious of metastasis along with a lesion in the thyroid gland. He has a mass palpable in the right central neck which moves with swallowing

- 1. What kind of imaging is displayed?
- 2. What diagnosis would you predict?
- 3. Is there a role for surgical management?
