His beginning

Was born in 16 November 1935, Belbin, Ashraqya, Egypt.

His father was a general surgeon and inspired him to become a doctor.

At the age of four, he witnessed the death of his aunt due to heart disease and inspired him to specialize in heart surgery.

He entered the Cairo university collage of medicine at the age of 15 on a full scholarship and graduated in 1957.

His career

- He moved to London in 1962 and worked in leading hospitals in cardiac surgery for the next 40 years.
- In 1968, he took a short break in US as a professor on Chicago and returned to London to resume his work in the UK.
- From 1969 to 2001 he worked at Harefield Hospital as a Consultant Cardiothoracic Surgeon.
- He became a Consultant Cardiothoracic Surgeon at Royal Brompton Hospital.
- In 1995 he founded the based children charity *(chain of*

hope).


His major work

- Established the Heart Sciences Center in London.
- Established the Heart
 Transplant Surgery Center in
 Britain
- Established the Chain of Hope charitable association for children in third world countries.
- Established the Magdi Yacoub Center for Cardiac Diseases and Research in Aswan.
- Has made major contributions to saving the lives of many children in the world who were born with posterior major vascular defects.
- Has made major contributions to the development of cardiovascular surgery in Jamaica, Mozambique, and Ethiopia.
- He has published more than 1,000 scientific articles and supervised more than From 18 Ph.D.
- Dr. Magdi Yacoub presented more than 400 scientific researches in heart transplantation

performed in his professional life more than 25,000 open heart operations,

including more than 2,500 heart transplants or heart and lung transplants,

the highest number achieved by a heart surgeon in the field of heart transplants is by him
